These enriching experiences are designed to deepen their understanding of critical issues affecting young people today. All students participated in engaging assemblies led by The Lucy Faithfull Foundation, where they explored essential topics such as consent, sexualised language, and the importance of responsible image sharing. These discussions were eye-opening and equipped students with the knowledge they need to navigate the challenges they might face.

Year 9 students took part in a thought-provoking session with The DECCA Team, focusing on the risks of substance misuse—whether it's tobacco, vapes, alcohol, or cannabis. Through interactive conversations and activities, students learned how to make informed choices and avoid the dangers of these substances.

Meanwhile, Year 8 students joined The

DECCA Team for an eye-opening session on alcohol use. They discussed the short and long-term effects of drinking and gained a deeper understanding of both the legal risks and personal consequences. As part of the session, students got to try "drunk goggles" to experience firsthand how alcohol can impair visual perception—an unforgettable, hands-on learning experience!

Cricket Sporting Success!

It is always great to that students are continuing to be successful outside of school, as well as inside. One of our Year 9 students, Gurprabhjodh has shown his cricketing talent as he has been selected for the under 14 summer squad Cricket team for Staffordshire county. There is a rigorous selection process before reaching this stage, so this is a huge achievement in itself. Not only that, but in his last season he was named as Staffordshire's top run scorer, scoring over 400 runs for his county and was presented with the Coaches Award at Staffordshire Cricket's annual awards evening in November 2024. Since then, Gurprabhjodh has taken his success's even further as he was promoted from Smethwick 5th men's team to Smethwick 3rd men's team after scoring his first 50 in senior cricket. This was one of his best summer season's since he started playing cricket at the age of 7, having scored over 1100 runs and took over 30 wickets. OAT Review Feedback - A message from Mr McKinniss

This week, leaders from Ormiston Academies Trust conducted a review of OSCA to see the progress that has been made. They came in and spoke with students and teachers, observed lessons and student workbooks. It was a very positive experience, and as the new head, was really useful to see the progress that has been made here at OSCA. I was able to feedback in our 'meet the team' parental coffee morning this week, but for those who were not able to attend I would like to share some feedback from the review.

'Behaviour and culture in the school is massively improved.'. I was pleased to hear this, given the work we have put in to 'The OSCA Way', which you can see on our website.

'Students spoken to, whether as part of a panel or in general conversation, were overwhelmingly polite. They were keen to express themselves and universally acknowledged that all aspects of the academy are better this year, the most noted area was that of behaviour and culture.'. This comment about how polite our students are was a real moment of pride, and it shows what an amazing community OSCA really is.

One of the foci was to ensure there are positive relationships within the OSCA community, and the work we have done so far is really starting to come through. 'Students acknowledge that relationships with teachers are improving, the introduction of Remind, Ask, Tell is a contributing significantly to this. Teachers acknowledge this as a positive change.'. We will be continuing to work on what we call 'positive collisions' to build the community.

I hope that you are able to see the improvements that are being made here at OSCA, as you support us in making OSCA the outstanding place it is. With all reviews we also have developments and we will be working hard to ensure that students receive the best education during their time here at OSCA.
